

Your acceptance of responsibility

RISKS: I accept that the event for which I am booking has risks of injury or death to me and others, and damage to property (*the risks*).

INSURANCE: I accept that the Quorn Hunt, its Masters, officers, employees and others acting on its behalf and the owners and lessors of the land over which the event takes place or the building in which it takes place or both (*the organisers*) may not insure or cover (indemnify) me against the risks.

I accept that if I subscribe or pay a day cap to hunt that I must be a member of the Countryside Alliance; this ensures that I have personal accident and public liability insurance.

I accept my responsibility to ensure that either the insurance cover for any vehicle I drive or horse that I and any accompanying minors may ride during the event is sufficient to cover liability for the risks or that if it isn't then I assume liability myself.

I have noted that the event or parts of it may not be in a public place (which may affect my insurance cover) and also that if I am not the policyholder of a vehicle I drive during the event then the insurance cover for the vehicle may be for risks to third parties only and not for damage to the vehicle.

MINORS: I assume the risks for me and for any accompanying minors for whom I am responsible.

LIABILITY: I release (hold harmless) the organisers and other participants from liability for any injury, disability, death or loss or damage to people or property whether arising from the negligence of the organisers and other participants or otherwise, except where this is not allowed by law.

REQUIREMENTS: I accept that the organisers may require me and any accompanying minors to obey instructions. These may include the wearing of specified safety clothing. I accept that that it is impossible to eliminate all risks of my acquiring or transmitting an infectious disease, and I will minimise the risk to myself and others by complying with the law and current governmental guidelines as well as any on-site instructions and signs. I accept that I may be refused entry or be told to leave should there be a breach of these.

Our advice

We advise that riders carry identification, contact details and any health information; a mobile telephone is also useful. You should wear head-gear made to BSEN1384 or better.

We advise that inexperienced riders or first timers are accompanied by an experienced rider and that all children be accompanied by an adult.

We advise that you be particularly careful when unboxing and mounting. Give yourself plenty of space and time. You are solely responsible for the safe parking of your vehicle.

We advise you to contact the Hunt Secretary or ride organiser if you are unsure where to park
